LANGUAGE ARTS

- Develop the foundational reading skills of phonemic awareness, phonics, decoding, high frequency words, word analysis, and fluency through explicit and systematic instruction.
- Hear, read, and discuss a variety of fiction and nonfiction literature including stories, poems, narrative nonfiction and articles.
- Learn and practice comprehension strategies including visualizing, making connections to the text, identifying the
 main idea and key details, analyzing characters, setting, plot, problem, and theme.
- Expand vocabulary by exploring word meanings and relationships, including antonyms and synonyms, multiplemeaning words, prefixes and suffixes, context clues, and basic dictionary skills.
- Utilize mentor texts to explore characteristics of genres and develop knowledge of writing and author's craft.
- Develop grammar, usage, capitalization, and punctuation skills.
- Practice and reinforce manuscript handwriting skills.

MATHEMATICS

- Develop a conceptual understanding of place value up to three-digit numbers.
- Master addition and subtraction facts up to 20.
- Apply strategies to add and subtract two digit numbers.
- Demonstrate an understanding of equality, addition and subtraction.
- Expand time, money, measurement, and geometry skills.
- · Interpret data and create a variety of graphs.
- · Learn various problem-solving strategies for one and two step problems.

SCIENCE & SOCIAL STUDIES

- Explore relationships in the natural world including animals, habitats, plants, seasons, weather, and space.
- Develop observational and organizational skills for scientific data and information.
- · Begin to read and understand maps.
- · Explore geography through the introduction of different regions, states, and countries across the globe.
- · Introduce and discuss positive character traits in relation to being a good citizen, community member, and friend.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

- · Learn body awareness, the value of exercise, and fitness as a means of good health and self-care.
- Develop eve-hand and eve-hand-foot coordination.
- · Improve on the skills of traveling safely during physical activity.

SPANISH

- Understand that our world is made up of many places where people speak different languages.
- Implement a routine for attendance, prayer, greetings, weather and feelings.
- Learn basic manners and understand basic classroom instructions.
- Practice counting to 30 and begin reading and writing numbers to 15.
- · Correctly use the concept of the grammatical gender.
- Focus on vocabulary units such as animals, body parts, family, clothing, colors, seasons, days of the week, and food.
- · Complete a cultural mini-unit on one specific Spanish-speaking country each quarter.

VISUAL & PERFORMING ARTS

- Introduce the difference between 2D and 3D art.
- Understand and apply the elements of art: line, shape, color, and texture.
- Introduce famous artists and periods of art history.
- Develop craftsmanship and fine motor skills.
- Recognize beat patterns in songs.
- Identify and describe melody, harmony and rhythm.
- Sing major scales forward and backward and pivot on the "do."
- Sing a major chord triad.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

- Identify, describe, and demonstrate the Fruits of the Spirit.
- Begin to learn about the different books of the Bible and how the Bible is structured.
- Explore stories from the Old and New Testament.

STEM & TECHNOLOGY

- · Begin practicing early typing skills, learning through educational apps and creative digital tools.
- Acquire a basic understanding of coding while developing patience, persistence, and problem solving skills.
- Explore imaginative and early engineering skills through guided hands-on projects.
- Practice digital citizenship by learning safe online choices and recognizing trustworthy sites.

LIBRARY

- Demonstrate proper care for library books and an understanding of respectful library behavior.
- Learn how to select appropriate books and follow library check-out procedures.
- Explore age-appropriate children's literature through engaging storytime experiences.

WELLNESS

- Focus on the value and benefits of a daily gratitude practice.
- Practice regular breathwork including 4-7-8 breathing.
- Learn and practice self-care skills such as nutrition, exercise, mindful eating, organization, empathy, self-control, perseverance, and conflict resolution.
- Identify qualities of a healthy relationship.
- Gain exposure to effective coping strategies.
- Practice conflict resolution skills.
- Identify healthy boundaries.
