Our belief in Christ and our relationship with Him shapes our words and actions.

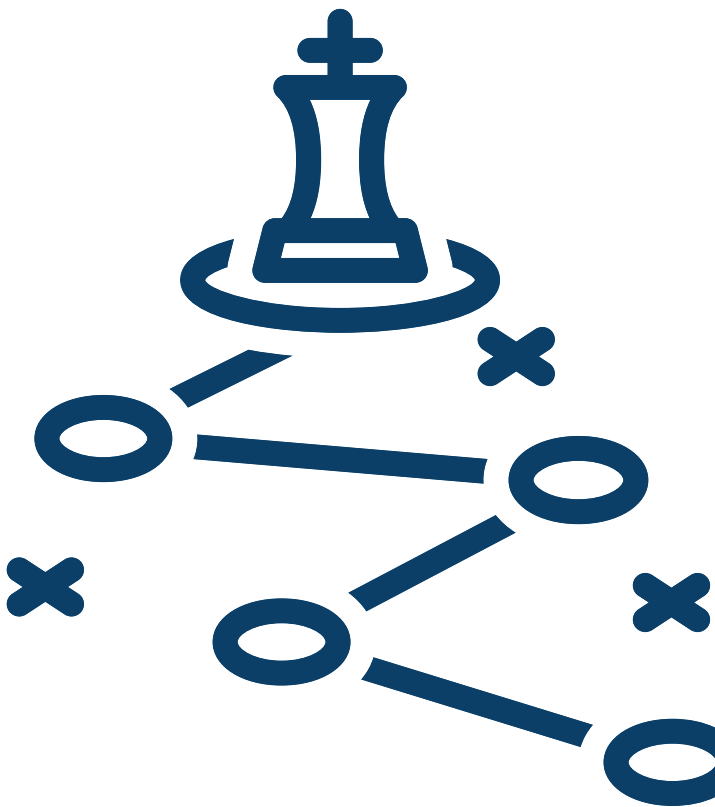
His love motivates us to serve and treat others with empathy and respect.
